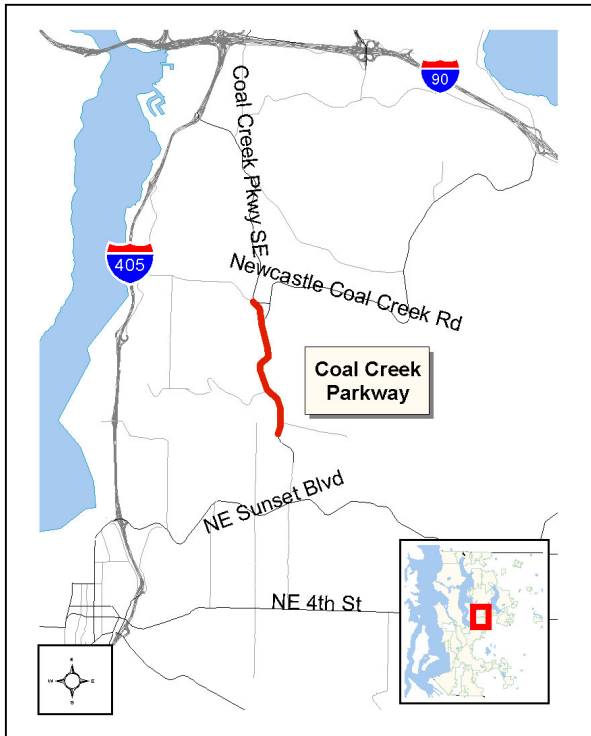
Coal Creek Parkway from Renton City Limits to SE 72nd Street

Project Description

Lead Agency: Newcastle

The project will provide four or five lanes between SR 900 in Renton and the Coal Creek Parkway / I-405 intersection in Bellevue. Bike lanes and sidewalks will be added throughout the route. The project is split into phases.

Performance

Delay & Congestion

9,240 Less hours people spend in congestion each day.

200 Less hours trucks spend in congestion each day.

6,520 Less hours vehicles spend in congestion each day.

Capacity, Speed, & Safety

16,730 More trips by people per day.

56% Increase in speed during evening commute.

Through computer modeling, it is estimated that if this project were not built, afternoon average travel speeds would be about 15 mph by 2015. By comparison if the project is built, afternoon travel speeds could average 24 mph.

What New Funding Will Achieve:

This project will improve the capacity of this north/south arterial corridor serving the urban areas east of I-405. The project will also improve pedestrian, bicycle, and vehicle safety.
